BIBLE STUDIES DURING LENT

Lent is a great season to spend time preparing for Easter and to discipline our lives in various ways. One good practice is to take the opportunity to read God's word.

Wicklow & Killiskey and Ashford & Glenealy parishioners are being invited to attend a series of joint bible studies. These will be held in houses in Ashford on five Monday evenings, commencing on 19th February and will feature the key places in the Holy Week story based on a booklet written by Rev Ken Rue. The first evening will take place in Ken and Lesley's house at 'Shancarrig', Cronroe. The evenings will be informal with a chance for open discussion. Refreshments are served afterwards which allows us to get to know our neighbours better.

On Tuesday evenings in Lent in the van der Fliers' house on Church Hill, Wicklow the studies will use the Biblical Association of the Church of Ireland's booklet "As the Father sent me, so I send you". This has been designed to foster a biblical approach to the Five Marks of Mission of the Anglican Communion simplified as

TELL, TEACH, TEND, TRANSFORM, TREASURE. These aspects of mission encompass the teaching and pastoral care required after initial conversion to the wider social and environmental challenges of the Gospel. The Bible studies have been written by five different people, including the Revd Jack Kinkead.

ECO TIPS — NEW YEAR REFLECTION AND CHALLENGE

We all need to heat our homes, but how do we do it in the most environmentally sensitive way? There are no easy solutions. Excellent insulation is the most important factor, but easiest to achieve when building a new house. Clearly one's options vary depending on where one lives and in what type of accommodation, e.g. contrast a rural house with an upper storey apartment. Environmentally, coal is not good, even if using smokeless fuel. As with coal, oil and natural gas also emit carbon dioxide, thus adding to global warming. Electricity sticks extract warmth from the air to provide heat so are a good option if electricity is using a renewable energy source. Geothermal heat extracts heat from the ground, again ideally achieved with new builds. Wood burning stoves are good (especially if one can grow one's own trees) but, if linked to a back boiler to heat water and radiators, need good quality dry hardwood or else the use of coal derivatives to increase the heat produced, negating the obvious benefits of using wood alone. However, in all cases, thermostats should be turned down.
