Thoughts for April



2 April. Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday, we have the opportunity to hear the whole story of Jesus' Passion read out in full, and a chance to experience the drama and tragedy of the series of events leading to his death on the cross. The Palm Sunday is typical of Jesus - acting subversively in his humility.

Holy Week - Each evening in Holy Week we move towards the cross of Good Friday, step by step. We wonder where we fit into the story, and to what extent we are complicit in the potential for darkness within humanity. On Good Friday, we reflect on how we have got into this mess.

9 April. Easter Day. Acts 10:34-43; Colossians 3:1-4; St Matthew 28:1-10.

Having journeyed with Jesus to the cross, with all its incumbent humiliation & forsakenness, the unstoppable power of God to transform and to work good out of evil forms the focus of our celebration of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead! Alleluia! Christ is risen!

16 April. Acts 2:14, 22-32; 1 Peter 1:3-9; St. John 20:19-31

On the second Sunday of Easter, we are in a very special time period in the life of Jesus, often overlooked. In this post-resurrection time, he spends time with his disciples, continuing to teach & support them in a new, post-resurrection world.

23 April. Acts 2:14, 36-41; 1 Peter 1:17-23; St Luke 24:13-35

As Jesus encounters 2 dejected disciples on their way home from Jerusalem, they know he has been executed, but haven't yet heard that he has risen again! Jesus patiently and methodically reveals himself through his exposition of the Scriptures, and through journeying and eating with them.

30 April. Acts 2:42-47; 1 Peter 2:19-25; St John 10:1-10

In a joint service in Nun's Cross, Killiskey, we will be joined by the current confirmation group as part of their preparation for making a public declaration of Christian faith in a few weeks time. A good opportunity to reflect on the place we make for faith in our own lives.

The Walk of Witness

This powerful but simple progression around Wicklow town sends a message to the wider community: that Christians here take seriously the events that lead to the death of Jesus on the cross. We meet in Wicklow Methodist Church at 7pm, where we sing a hymn, and listen to the first part of the Passion Narrative. We then walk to Wicklow Church of Ireland, carrying a large cross (taking turns to help carry, if you like), where we sing another hymn & hear the second part of the Passion Narrative. We then walk to St Patrick's Catholic Church, for a service of prayers and music centred on the story of Good Friday. Please do make this event a priority in your Holy Week journey.



Family Service & Joint Service



For just €25, you'll receive expert guidance on organ registration and performance, as well as the opportunity to perform a prepared piece.






Safeguarding Trust

Safeguarding Trust is the Church of Ireland's child protection policy. Any volunteers who work with groups for under 18s, or with vulnerable adults, must undertake Safeguarding Trust training. Each parish Select Vestry appoints a Panel, to ensure that Safeguarding Trust is being fully implemented, and to meet should any issue arise. In Wicklow and Killiskey, the Panel members are: Rev Jack Kinkead (0861727654), Allyson Minion, Tony Mulrain (0871171066), (0868597423), Rev Ken Rue (0872766590), and Daphne Smith (0879152777). If you have any concern regarding child safety, please contact one of the panel without delay. https://www.ireland.anglican.org/about/sa feguarding. Since the last Select Vestry meeting, there have been no incidents reported to the Safeguarding Trust Panel.

Select Vestries

Both Select Vestries met towards the end of January, and both discussed the practicalities around Rev Jack now having sole responsibility for both Wicklow and Killiskey parishes. Both vestries are engaging in processes of looking towards a sustainable future for the parish community, and welcome the input of the wider parish family. Although overall outgoings have reduced, finance continues to be a perpetual worry, and the vestries appeal to parishioners to consider planned giving for financial contributions either standing order or donation envelopes. Planned Giving

Please consider renewing or beginning your financial commitment to Killiskey Parish by way of Planned Giving. By doing this you can maximise the amount of money received by the Parish and greatly assist the Parish to meet its financial commitments. Planned Giving is making a pledge to donate an amount of money regularly over the course of the year whether weekly, monthly, quarterly or by a single donation. Under the tax regulations, the Parish, as a registered charity, can obtain a tax refund from the government for recorded donations from tax payers (PAYE and Self-Assessment)

who contribute a minimum of €250 in the tax year. This is the equivalent of €4.81 per week. The parish can claim a further approx. 45% of the amount donated from the government. Cash donations on the plate, while very gratefully received, are not eligible for a tax refund. If you are contributing more than €250 over the course of the year through this method, you might like to consider Planned Giving.

Eco Tips

April 2023 IPCC Report

One of the best-known bible stories. immortalised and popularised in the musical "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat", is that of Joseph interpreting the Egyptian Pharaoh's dreams. He foretold seven years of plenty followed by seven years of famine. Accordingly, he organised the saving and storage of grain from each of the good years. When famine came, he rationed out the grain to the Egyptians and they survived, whereas people from other nations starved. We could all learn a valuable lesson from this biblical tale. The International Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has just issued its most stark report yet. Global temperatures are already 1.09°C higher than before industrialisation took place.

Once the increase reaches 1.5°C, more catastrophic effects of climate change will manifest themselves - untold human suffering from increasingly violent storms, sea level rise from melting ice, floods and, conversely, drought and desertification etc.; famines and food shortages will be rife. Environmental damage and the loss to biodiversity will escalate and become irreversible. However, if we follow Joseph's example, but in a modern context, we could avoid precipitating such global disaster. The good news is that IT IS POSSIBLE - e.g. by investing in technological change and by voluntarily reducing our consumption. We can ALL play our part now by not buying products we don't need, reducing waste, excessive travel, fuel from overheating homes and businesses. Test yourselves and see how much you can reduce consumption saves money too!
