Thoughts for May



7 May. Acts 7:55-60; St. John 14:1-14 - The readings today point us towards the understanding that to accept the supremacy of Christ as Lord is not to become immune to life's challenges - indeed, a life of faith may well lead us to encounter experiences of suffering. The reconciling ministry of Christ is ever more important in such circumstances.

14 May. Acts 17:22-30; St. John 14:15-21

The readings today are reassuring, in that they remind us that we do not go through this life alone. Paul calls the Athenians to repent - to literally turn away from a multi-God understanding of the universe, to a universal understanding of One God. The idea of an 'unknown God' is anathema to Paul, as God has been made known to us in Christ; St John looks forward to the omnipresence of God's Holy Spirit, by whom the transforming work of Jesus continues.

21 May. Acts 1:6-14; Acts 1:6-14; St John 17:1-11

On this Sunday after Ascension, we give some thought to the continuing work of Christ, and the centrality of prayer. The Gospel reading is part of a prayer prayed by Jesus himself, and is ultimately a prayer for unity. We will have the opportunity this morning to spend time in prayer - for unity between us and God; for unity between us. & our fellow humanity; for unity within the body of Christ: the Church. As we come before God, we must come in humility.

28 May. Acts 2:1-21; St John 7:37-39

Today's first reading is the dramatic revelation of the Holy Spirit to the early church: wild, vivid, unexpected. The short Gospel reading is slightly puzzling, as it seems to suggest that the Spirit only comes into being after Jesus' glorification. However, we are once again brought to Jesus as the hub around which all else is ordered. People's understanding of God as creator and Spirit is reordered and rekindled through the incarnation of Jesus himself.



Safeguarding Trust

Safeguarding Trust is the Church of Ireland's child protection policy. Any volunteers who work with groups for under 18s, or with vulnerable adults, must undertake Safeguarding Trust training. Each parish Select Vestry appoints a Panel, to ensure that Safeguarding Trust is being fully implemented, and to meet should any issue arise. In Wicklow and Killiskev, the Panel members are: Rev Jack Kinkead (0861727654), Allyson Minion, Tony Mulrain (0871171066), (0868597423), and Daphne Smith (0879152777). Since the last Select Vestry meeting, there have been no incidents reported to the Safeguarding Trust Panel.

Select Vestries

Both Select Vestries met towards the end of January, and both discussed the practicalities around Rev Jack now having sole responsibility for both Wicklow and Killiskey parishes. Both vestries are engaging in processes of looking towards a sustainable future for the parish community, and welcome the input of the wider parish family. Although overall outgoings have reduced, finance continues to be a perpetual worry, and the vestries appeal to parishioners to consider planned giving for financial contributions either standing order or donation envelopes. 

Planned Giving

Please consider renewing or beginning your financial commitment to Killiskey Parish by way of Planned Giving. By doing this you can maximise the amount of money received by the Parish and greatly assist the Parish to meet its financial commitments. Planned Giving is making a pledge to donate an amount of money regularly over the course of the year whether weekly, monthly, quarterly or by a single donation. Under the tax regulations, the Parish, as a registered charity, can obtain a tax refund from the government for recorded donations from tax payers (PAYE and Self-Assessment)

who contribute a minimum of €250 in the tax year. This is the equivalent of €4.81 per week. The parish can claim a further approx. 45% of the amount donated from the government. Cash donations on the plate, while very gratefully received, are not eligible for a tax refund. If you are contributing more than €250 over the course of the year through this method, you might like to consider Planned Giving.

Eco Tips

May 2023 IPCC Report

Mary Donnelly heads the Irish Climate Change Advisory Council. It would make huge economic sense for the government to take on board some of her comments. To increase carbon uptake, Ireland needs to plant 8,000 hectares of woodland annually, but at present we are only achieving 2,000 ha/year. We urgently need to set specific targets on land use to indicate how we will reach net zero C emissions. Farming practices have always changed through time and this needs to continue, but farmers will need advice and substantial financial support to adopt sustainable farming practices. Emissions need to decrease across ALL sectors, yet in Ireland they are actually increasing.

By 2030, it is estimated that Ireland will be paying a minimum of €8 billion on carbon credits to offset emissions, BUT carbon credits may not be available as so many other countries will be doing likewise. It would make much more sense to spend €8billion on reducing our emissions, instead of paying fines, and to transition to a low carbon lifestyle, not just on farms but in urban areas too. The challenge is for individuals, companies, industries and government to heed the advice of Mary Donnelly.
