Thoughts for November



5 November. Joshua 3:7-17; St. Matthew 23:1-12

Today's readings teach us two important things: in times of transition, trust in God's providence and steadfastness. Also, do not ask another to bear a burden that you yourself would not carry.

12 November. Joshua 24:1-3, 14-25; St. Matthew 25:1-13

On Remembrance Sunday, as we remember those who paid the ultimate sacrifice, we also renew our commitment to peace in our time. The readings remind us of the possibility of renewal after a time of turbulence, but also to avoid complacency in times that seem settled.

19 November. Judges 4:1-7; St Matthew 25:14-30

Today's readings challenge us on where we invest our efforts and energies. Where we are lazy or self-centred, we find ourselves drifting from God and the opportunities that there are to make a difference in our world.

26 November. Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24; St Matthew 25:31-46

Ezekiel takes a slightly unusual approach in his description of God as shepherd this morning, castigating those who grow rich while making others poorer and more vulnerable. The Gospel is a well known observation of judgement, as Jesus teaches that God will judge us based on our compassion towards vulnerable people.

Wicklow coffee rota


Thanks to those who have signed up so far, to help provide tea / coffee after the 9.30am services. Please let Jack know if you are able to help with this occasionally.




Help needed!

Planned Giving

Please consider renewing or beginning your financial commitment to Killiskey Parish by way of Planned Giving. By doing this you can maximise the amount of money received by the Parish and greatly assist the Parish to meet its financial commitments. Planned Giving is making a pledge to donate an amount of money regularly over the course of the year whether weekly, monthly, quarterly or by a single donation. Under the tax regulations, the Parish, as a registered charity, can obtain a tax refund from the government for recorded donations from tax payers (PAYE and Self-Assessment) who contribute a minimum of €250 in the tax year. This is the equivalent of €4.81 per week. The parish can claim a further approx. 45% of the amount donated from the government. Cash donations on the plate, while very gratefully received, are not eligible for a tax refund.

If you are contributing more than €250 over the course of the year through this method, you might like to consider Planned Giving.


Ashford Gift & Book Shop - The Hub

SOULS OF OUR SHOES EXHIBITION

ST. SAVIOURS CHURCH, ARKLOW

FRIDAY 24th NOVEMBER TO MONDAY 27th NOVEMBER 2023



An exhibition showcasing shoes that speak on behalf of victims of domestic abuse and violence. The physical shoes in the 'Souls of our Shoes' exhibition are accompanied by comments from those that have walked away from abuse, and those who journey with them.

The exhibition has travelled throughout ireland and is part of the Mothers' Union Initiatives to highlight domestic abuse and the practical and prayerful support we offer to families. The issue of Domestic Violence is often hidden but is unfortunately in every community and society around the world. It is surrounded by secrecy and pain.

1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men suffer from some sort of domestic violence/abuse. We hope by displaying this exhibition we can help to highlight this issue and signpost help available.

The exhibition opens on Friday evening at 7.30pm, will be open Saturday 10am — 4pm, Sunday 2pm to 6pm and Monday 10am to 4pm. We encourage as many people as possible to attend. There will be tea/coffee & traybakes available in the church hall beside the church. Our speaker at the Sunday morning service at 11.30am in St. Saviours Church Arksow, will be Mirs Lesile Bayley. Diocesan President of Cashel Ferns & Ossory Diocese — herself a survivor of domestic abuse.

All are welcome to attend the exhibition but please note that the exhibition is primarily intended for adults as the subject matter may be disturbing.

Eco Tips

November 2023

The beauty and value of hedgerows
Spring saw the hawthorn (or aptly
named may) trees ablaze with
blossom. This autumn the trees are
bearing the fruits of all those flowers,
with hedgerows abounding with red
berries. Apart from their aesthetic
value, the flowers and haws are
wonderful for wildlife – pollinators,
small mammals, birds. They also
provide shelter from wind and rain
along field boundaries for farm stock.

Other native tree and shrub species occur, such as guelder rose, spindle, hazel (with bountiful nuts this year), holly (already bearing a profusion of red berries) etc., all interwoven with a jumble of bramble and ivy, which also provide great food and shelter. These healthy hedgerows are in stark contrast to those so evident in many areas, where fields are divided by short, stubby, over-trimmed "neat" barriers that barely deserve the moniker hedgerow. Not only are they poor reservoirs for wildlife, but their carbon sequestration abilities are seriously compromised. In the current era of biodiversity crisis and climate change, the value of trees cannot be overstated and maintaining proper hedgerows is one way to assist in this challenge. All landowners, be they of small rural holdings or larger farms, can play their part by allowing their hedges to flourish. Urban dwellers, too, can plant native shrub species in their gardens.
